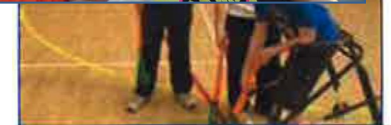
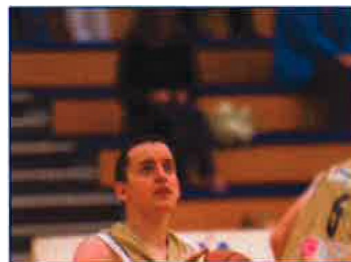

There is no charge for campers to attend Camp Fatima.</p> <p>Each camper is assigned his or her own counselor who provides 24 hour a day individualized care, with the help of a team of registered nurses, lifeguards, counselor support and administrators, as well as kitchen, arts and crafts, and activities staffs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2021 Overnight Camp</li> <li>August 8-14, 2021</li> <li>We will accept a maximum of 32 campers. Only returning campers, age 16 and up will be considered for acceptance. Each accepted camper must be fully vaccinated by July 24<sup>th</sup> and able to adhere to mask and social distance requirements throughout the week. All campers must also receive approval from a healthcare provider to attend overnight camp.</li> <li>Arts &amp; Crafts – the Arts and Crafts staff provides the opportunity for campers of all interests and abilities to practice fine motor skills and be creative. A&amp;C is a collaborative area where campers and staff work together to create and experiment.</li> <li>Sense Room – the Sense Room is a space that provides both active and calming areas, as well as various types of sensory activities for campers to enjoy. These areas offer an opportunity to combine a range of stimuli such as light, color, sound, texture, taste, aroma and motor skills to engage the senses within an environment that promotes exploration and interaction in a safe place. One of the best parts of being involved in the sense room is knowing that you can find something for almost everyone to enjoy and having the opportunity to expand on every child’s individual interests.</li> <li>Destination Fatima/Café Perk – Destination Fatima and Café Perk bring the experience of a café and an open-mic coffee house to the campers and staff. Campers can request music, sing and dance on stage, play real instruments, be part of the show and experience the thrill of being rock stars. Campers, counselors and staff can also relax with refreshing cool drinks or fun, themed coffee beverages to help power them through the rest of their Fatimagical day.</li> <li>Waterfront – Waterfront provides an opportunity for the kids to let loose and cool off after a long day of fun in the sun. The waterfront staff consists of certified lifeguards who supervise swimming as well as boating and fishing at the nearby lake. During the week waterfront hosts activities such as luaus and pool parties. They may also offer other games and events.</li> </ul>

We will bunk the campers each session by under 18-year olds and by 18 and older adult age groupings (and of course will always separate all campers by gender). It may be possible we cannot accommodate 16 and 17-year olds in every session if there are not enough vaccinated campers at these ages to be able to fill a cabin for each session.</li> <li>• The campers and counselors in each of our six cabins will travel to and participate in activities and meals together, keeping separated from other cabins to ensure limited exposure if for any reason we end up with a COVID positive case at the camp.
