## BOARD SECRETARY/BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Board Secretary John Susino made the following report to the Board.

Mr. Susino first spoke to the impact of the proposed health benefits premium increase on the school district.

Today the Board is considering a resolution, number 23-A-22T, that expresses the Board's opposition to the proposed rate increase for health benefits coverage as provided by the State of New Jersey School Employees Benefits Program.

The proposed rate increase of over 15% was announced after the adoption the district's operating budget, thus posing a significant budgetary challenge to the Board. Specifically, the district will be faced with an unbudgeted cost of over \$834,000 just for the first six months of the plan year.

This increase will also be shouldered by participating staff members through higher premium costs. Finally, the Board opposes the rate increase as it comes after the passage of public law 2020, commonly known as Chapter 44, which was designed and adopted by the State of NJ to minimize rate increase through plan and benefit offerings, as well as higher out of pocket costs for participating members.

Mr. Susino also reported to the Board that in the coming months, the administration will be implementing a fully digital board packet and agenda. All resolutions will be sent via a secure web-based portal. Board members will be able to view and comment on resolutions through this portal. As we near the time of implementation, Mr. Susino will schedule a training for each Board member.

Mr. Susino thanked the district's operations and maintenance staff, led by Operations Director Tom Jodice, for their tireless work in getting our buildings ready for the start of school later this week.

# ❖ <u>DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS, ACCOLADES AND OTHER IMPORTANT DISTRICT INFORMATION</u>

Dr. Lerner shared some highlights of the many accomplishments our students and staff have had, including the following:

## Navigating Success Through Wellness Initiative

- We are beginning Senior Transition Groups for graduating students to ease the changes and challenges they would face entering college or the workforce, along with freshmen Resilience Training will begin in September.
- We conducted several parent and student virtual seminars over the summer, including *Time Management and Organization, Freshmen Transition*, and the *Power of Positivity*.
- Wellness screenings for all 700 incoming freshmen were conducted and completed over the summer months.

## APPLIED TECHNOLOGY HIGH SCHOOL

 This summer ATHS students across all grade levels participated in the summer CTE workshop. During this two-week program students explored advanced concepts related to cybersecurity, robotics, and emergency medical care.

## BERGEN COUNTY ACADEMIES

- Congratulations to BCA's 2022 National Merit Scholar Finalists! Out of a total of 15,000 students nationwide who were recognized as high scorers, 54 BCA seniors were named finalists. This is the highest number of finalists in our school's history.
- BCA students excelled in the recent American Computer Science League Finals. Several students earned gold, silver and bronze medals in the senior, intermediate and junior levels.

# PARAMUS CAMPUS

 During the month of July over 150 students from the Paramus Campus technical areas attended a CTE Summer Enrichment program. The program was held four days a week for two hours a day, throughout the entire month of July, giving students the opportunity to participate in activities to enhance their individual hands on experience.

#### TETERBORO CAMPUS

- A Bergen Tech Fashion student won the gold with a total score of 96.66/100, and placed in the Top 10 National Finalists in the Fashion Design Junior/Senior category, at this year's FCCLA National Leadership Conference held at San Diego, California. Bergen Tech was the only school from NJ to place in the Top 10 from this category.
- A Bergen Tech Law & Justice student was accepted to and attended the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute an all-expenses paid leadership experience in Washington D.C.

## ADULT EDUCATION

- Our daytime trade programs are almost full for the classes starting in fall of 2022. There is
  even a waitlist for our electrical program and few spots left for our HVAC and Plumbing
  course.
- Adult Education and New Bridge Medical Center have teamed up to create internship and apprenticeship opportunities for our students and alumni within the plumbing and electrical fields.

# Institute for Interactive Design @ Northern Valley – Demarest & Old Tappan

- The Institute for Interactive Design program is entering its third year.
- The Institute for Sports Medicine & Exercise Science program will launch its pilot year on September 2, with their first freshman class.
