Dr. Lerner shared highlights of the many accomplishments of our students and staff, including the following:

NAVIGATING SUCCESS THROUGH WELLNESS INITIATIVE

- Completed freshmen wellness "Meet and "Greet" screenings: 6 social workers; four days a week 10:00 AM 3:00 PM and 2 social workers in the evening from 7:00 8:30 PM.
- Start of NSTW summer program "Fun Time in the Sunshine" mini courses on wellness and performance for students of all grades, all campuses.

APPLIED TECHNOLOGY HIGH SCHOOL

• The guidance department held their annual senior meeting to prepare for the upcoming school year. Twelfth grade students at ATHS maintain a full college course load. This meeting covered the Bergen Community College registration process, course prerequisites, and internships requirements.

BERGEN COUNTY ACADEMIES

- This summer, over one hundred middle school students from throughout Bergen County participated in the "Academy After Hours" program. The program serves as an outreach initiative geared toward students in grades 6-8, seeking to pursue advanced coursework in the sciences, humanities, mathematics, computer science, and visual and performing arts.
- Students interested in advancing their science research skills recently took part in the BCA Summer Research Program. Students were able to work side by side with their teachers and dedicate numerous hours working with the advanced equipment in our research labs. This hands-on training allows our students to compete in state, national and international science competitions

PARAMUS CAMPUS

On July 27th, the Paramus Culinary and Bake shop partnered with Lasagna Love, to celebrate
National Lasagna Day. Lasagna Love is a worldwide nonprofit organization seeking to make
a positive difference in communities by facilitating homemade meal deliveries among
neighbors less fortunate. 200 lasagnas were prepared, on site, and distributed to families
throughout the state, as well as several food pantries.

- Congratulations to an 11th grade Commercial Art student whose BC Teen Arts Festival
 watercolor submission was chosen as one of 20 to be displayed at the county show at One
 Bergen Plaza. This student also recently started a Caring Through Art program, which
 invites students to volunteer and host art workshops at nursing homes and independent living
 facilities.
- Introducing BT's 2023 Design Challenge! The guiding question in this year's 2023 Design Challenge was "How can STEM-based solutions improve the efficacy of public policy initiatives?" Students in the Law & Justice, Aerospace Engineering, and Auto Engineering & Design majors had the opportunity to showcase their respective talents and use their ideas to propel public policy.
