- **Board of Education Special Meeting**
 - Mr. Susino, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, informed the Board and members of the public that the Board of Education scheduled a special meeting for 5:00 p.m. on August 8, 2023.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

❖ **HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING REPORT**

The District is required to report specific incidents of harassment, intimidation, or bullying (hereafter "HIB") to the Board of Education. This past month, the District had four (4) HIB investigations. After thorough investigations, it was determined that all four were confirmed HIB incidents.

- **HIB Incident: HIB Case #13 – Teterboro - School Year 2022-2023**

Incident—Insulting or demeaning electronic comments that the offender knew would cause the victims harm. This created a hostile educational environment.
Intervention—Offender is receiving individual counseling. The two victims are receiving periodic follow-up from counselor. Parent contact made.
- **HIB Incident: HIB Case #14 – IIDT - School Year 2022-2023**

Incident—Insulting or demeaning verbal comments that the offender knew would cause the victim harm. This placed the victim in fear of physical or emotional harm, and interfered with the victim's education.
Intervention—Offender received counseling and other disciplinary measures. Victim is from another school. Parent contact made.
- **HIB Incident: HIB Case #15 – IIDT - School Year 2022-2023**

Incident—Insulting or demeaning verbal comments that the offender knew would cause the victim harm. This placed the victim in fear of physical or emotional harm, and interfered with the victim's education.
Intervention—Offender from another school. Victim receiving individual counseling. Parent contact made.
- **HIB Incident: HIB Case #16 – Paramus - School Year 2022-2023**

Incident—Insulting or demeaning verbal and electronic comments that the offenders knew would cause the victim harm. This placed the victim in fear of physical or emotional harm, interfered with the victim's education, and created a hostile educational environment.

Intervention—Two offenders were offered restorative group counseling. Victim receiving periodic follow-up. Parent contact made.

❖ **DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS, ACCOLADES AND OTHER IMPORTANT DISTRICT INFORMATION**

- **NAVIGATING SUCCESS THROUGH WELLNESS INITIATIVE**
 - Facilitated Freshmen Resilience and Mental Health Awareness Day with "Rock Yoga" at Paramus campus
 - Began Junior "Self-Expression Through Art" seminar
 - Provided crisis / support group at Adult Education.

 - **APPLIED TECHNOLOGY HIGH SCHOOL**
 - On Thursday, June 8th, ATHS held the 6th annual Young Women in Leadership Conference. The speaking panel included six guest speakers – an immigration attorney, a pediatric dentist, a nurse practitioner, mental health clinicians and law enforcement. The focus is centered on each person's respective journey to their career path. Students also had an opportunity to ask questions and network with professionals during the event.

 - **BERGEN COUNTY ACADEMIES**
 - Twenty-two students in various research programs at BCA recently presented their work at the New Jersey Academy of Science. This in person competition gave students the opportunity to present their scientific presentation at the national "American Academy of Science" competition in California. Congratulations to everyone involved.
 - BCA's production of *Fiddler on the Roof* won big at the first ever Bergen PAC High School Theatre Awards. BCA won awards for *Outstanding Ensemble Role* and *Outstanding Choreography of a Musical*. Congratulations to our students and staff.

 - **PARAMUS CAMPUS**
 - Congratulations to a Junior Healthcare student who achieved an outstanding 1st Place victory at the HOSA International Leadership Conference in Dallas, TX.
 - The Brian Meeney Memorial Garden officially opened on Tuesday, June 13th. The dedication ceremony included recognition of the Environmental Design and Green Building Trades students responsible for constructing and designing the garden, unveiling of a memorial bench and sign, and remarks by the Meeney family. We encourage all of you to visit the garden, in the rear of the Paramus campus, near the silo.

 - **TETERBORO CAMPUS**
 - An 11th grade Law & Justice student was selected for the 2023 Achievement Award in Writing given by the National Council of Teachers of English. Bergen Tech's ACS Chem club team won the first prize in the "Chemagination" contest conducted this year by the American Chemical Society. Their project was in the Environment category. - McLaren Engineering Co. sat in on project presentations with 11th graders to critique their presenting skills and product presentations from a professional perspective.
- **Exercise Science/Sports Medicine**
 - Sports Medicine students at Northern Valley Demarest and Old Tappan were able to come together for the first time to participate and compete in the first Sports Medicine Field Day. In teams, students competed in events such as Blindfolded Ankle tape relay race, Crutch fitting and wrapping obstacle course, Pin the Band-Aid on the skeleton, and other Sports Medicine related skill events.
- **ADULT EDUCATION**
 - On May 25, 2023, our plumbing program and our electrical program hosted their occupational advisory boards. Multiple employers attended each program and provided valuable feedback for the course as well as an opportunity to connect with our students.
 - With our partnership with Reiner, five of our currently enrolled HVAC students were accepted to become interns through the WBA program.
- **EMS**
 - Our career fire class completed on Tuesday June 13, 2023. We had fire fighters from Englewood, Teaneck and Hackensack.
 - We provided a virtual lecture and demonstration pertaining to medical emergencies to students at Saint George University / Medical School in Grenada
- **ATHLETICS**
 - Boys Tennis won the NJSIAA North 1 Group 4 sectional title.
- **BERGEN COUNTY JOB CENTER**
 - We had the opportunity to present to the FSTF during a lunch & learn hour.
 - Participated in the Food Pantry Summit at BCC.
 - Presented to the Housing Advocacy & Homeless Prevention Monthly Meeting.
- **BELA**
 - BELA had a wonderful time at our first ever *Donuts with Dad!*
