# <u>PUBLIC PARTICIPATON — ANY ISSUE</u>

Several BCA students appeared before the Board to express their concerns over the handling of a HIB incident that occurred in October of 2022. The students (Elena Jacoby, Kailey Correa, Pooja Rayapaneni, Kayla Luga, Emily Zhang, and Eleni Brenna) provided details of the incident to the Board. They also thanked Assistant Superintendent Andrea Sheridan for her involvement in reviewing the incident.

Board Members Connelly, Kim, DeLisio and Gadaleta each expressed concern over the incident and its troubling nature. They thanked the students for their bravery in presenting to the Board. Board President William Connelly expressed confidence that Superintendent Lerner and Assistant Superintendent Sheridan are handling the matter and asked that Dr. Lerner report back to the Board upon his receipt of additional information.

# **EXECUTIVE SESSION:**

At 6:06 p.m., a motion to recess the Public Work Session and move the meeting to the Private Executive Session, per the Resolution below, was made by Mr. Kim and seconded by Mr. DeLisio. All members present voted in the affirmative; none opposed.

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Open Public Meetings Act of the State of New Jersey permits the public to be excluded from certain matters to be discussed by the Board; and

WHEREAS the Board intends to convene in private session from which the public shall be excluded to dismiss matters which permit the exclusion of the public, during which minutes shall be taken; and

WHEREAS the matters to be discussed fall under the exclusion of confidentiality required by Federal or State Law; impair a right to receive Federal government funds; unwarranted invasion of individual privacy; collective bargaining agreement negotiations; purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds; tactics and techniques to protect safety of property of public, or investigations of violations or potential violations of law; pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiations, or matters falling within the attorney-client privilege; personnel/employment matters unless individual requests that matter be discussed in public; deliberations after public hearing that may result in imposition of penalty;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the public portion of the meeting shall now be recessed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a summary of the closed session minutes shall be made available to the public by the next public meeting of the Board of Education, or upon approval of the minutes, and once the need for confidentiality no longer exists.

A motion to resume the Public Work Session meeting was made at 6:37 p.m. by Mr. Kim, seconded by Mr. DeLisio. All members present voted in the affirmative; none opposed.

A motion to adjourn the Public Work Session meeting was made at 6:37 p.m. by Ms. Gadaleta, seconded by Mr. Kim. All members present voted in the affirmative; none opposed. No further action was taken by the Board.
