SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

❖ HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING REPORT

The district is required to report specific incidents of harassment, intimidation, or bullying to the Board of Education. This past month we had two HIB investigations. After a thorough investigation, it was determined that one was a non-HIB incident, and one was a confirmed HIB incident as follows:

• HIB Incident: HIB Case #1 – IIDT - School Year 2023-2024

- o Incident—Insulting or demeaning verbal comments made by two offenders to one victim.
- o Intervention—Offenders received a 3-day suspension and signed behavioral contracts. They and their parents are receiving restorative counseling. The victim and offenders will ride separate buses. The victim has been offered counseling. Parent contact was made.
